In comparison to last month, our complaints and incidents have nearly doubled; summer is definitely here even though the weather has not fully cooperated.

Last month I reported the Jeremy Pajac was resigning. I have spoken with Jeremy in regards to staying on our roster in the event that he wanted to return. It was agreed that he will stay on our roster as an inactive officer. It is at no cost to the Town and we will revisit this in one year.

The posting for the part time police officer position was closed on June 20. We had approximately 5 applicants, one of which had the qualification and certifications required. On June 27, Town Administrator Clark and I interviewed Adam Leask Jr. At the end of the interview it was discussed to give Adam a preliminary job offer which would depend on a back ground check as well as board approval (you cannot do a back ground check without a preliminary job offer). Adam has passed his back ground check. Adam is originally from Bayfield and currently holds a part time position for the Red Cliff Police Department. Adam has ties to the Island as his mother in law owns a home on Big Bay Road. I believe that Adam would be a perfect fit for the La Pointe Police Department and request the board's final approval for hire. I would like to have him start his training as soon as possible.

On June 25, the island was visited by agents from the State Department of Revenue, Alcohol and Tobacco division. The Agency did not notify the police department that they were coming, however, Chief Defoe was asked to assist them when they came to the island. As far as the police department's knowledge, only minor infractions were found. It is unknown if the agents cited anyone.
