Re: Monthly Police Report for October 2013

During the month of September 2013 the La Pointe Police Department responded to the following:

- 80 Various Complaints/Incidents
- 5 Citizen Assist Requests
- 4 Before/After Duty Call Outs
- 1 Parking Violations
- 5 Vehicle Title/Registrations
- 2 Non-Reportable Traffic Accident
- 4 Reportable Accidents
- 8 Traffic Citations
- 2 Animal Call
- 3 Civil Process served

In September, the Department of Transportation, Bureau Of Traffic Safety (BOTS) announced the recipients of equipment grants for taking part in the May/June "Click it or Ticket" (CIOT) program. The La Pointe PD was not awarded any grant money this time around but we will continue to participate with the efforts to bring awareness the importance of buckling up/in and get more people to wear their safety belts.

In the beginning of September, we completed the "Drive Sober Or Get Pulled Over" (DSOGPO) education campaign to prevent impaired driving. The (DSOGPO) and the (CIOT) are national campaigns that have greatly reduced the number of injuries/deaths throughout the country. I was informed by our district DOT representative that there's been complications of funding being released at the federal level thus delaying the (CIOT) as well as the (DSOGPO) grants which generally took place 4 to 6 weeks after completion. There's no telling when they'll announce who will get grants for the (DSOGPO) program.

Also in September, all officers completed mandatory "Emergency Vehicle Operations Course" (EVOC) as set forth by the Department of Justice, Training and Standards Bureau. The training was sponsored by WITC and took place at the Ashland Airport.

On September 25, I had (hopefully my last) Doctor appointment for my leg. He said it's healing fine and should be another 3 months before its fully healed. He's said all along, let common sense dictate restrictions, it was no different this time either.
